Events

- 1. Opossum always brags about his tail.
- Rabbit decides to play a trick on Opossum.
- 3. Rabbit suggests that Opossum let Cricket trim his tail so it will look nice for the dance.
- Instead of trimming the hair on Opossum's tail,
 Cricket cuts it all off.
- 5. Cricket covers Opossum's tail with a ribbon.
- Opossum takes off the ribbon at the dance, and he discovers his tail is bald and scaly.

Notes:

- Event #1 has to be included because it explains WHY the trick is played on Opossum. Without it, none of the other events would happen.
- Events #3, 4, and 5 explain HOW the trick is carried out. It's not enough to just say: "Cricket cut the hair off Opossum's tail." Event #3 connects Rabbit (#2) to Cricket (#4). Event #5 connects Cricket (#4) to the dance at the end (#6).
- Because Event #6 happens "at the end" of the story, and tells the reader what is in the "after" box, it would be repetitive to write both event #6 and the "At the end, ..." sentence in the paragraph. So in this case, the recipe is adjusted. Event #6 is written to include the "after" box, and is followed by the concluding sentence. (See the example paragraph.)
