
## Title: Aunt Eater Follows a Sweater

## Solution

Aunt Eater discovers that Pat has Miss Wainscot's diamond ring and other shiny things.

## Events

- 1. Aunt Eater calls Mr. Bundy, the hotel detective.
- 2. Aunt Eater notices that her sweater is missing.
- 3. She sees a piece of yarn on the windowsill, and follows it until she comes to Pat the Mynah bird.

Notes:

- Event #1 does not have to be included, and Event #3 can be split into two.
- Event #2 can be mistaken as the "Problem" of the story, but the story is not about finding Aunt Eater's sweater. Rather, it helps her to solve the bigger problem that of the missing ring.
- Pat should be mentioned in the last event, or in the solution, as it is he who is responsible for the missing ring.
