Dear Students,

It snows here about 30" a year. It is windy also so we have big drifts. We do not get milk by the gallon here--all our stuff comes by helicopter only once a week--sometimes only every three weeks--we drink dry milk or canned milk. Gas here costs \$2.65==it is for a few snow machines and to heat the houses. Most of our animals are ocean mammals--lots of seals, walrus, and some whales. There are a few arctic foxes that live here all year. In the summer we have millions of birds everywhere. Our resources are our animals and walrus ivory that our dads carve. We get help at the clinic when we are sick. A health aide helps us. If someone gets really sick or hurt bad we have to call for a medivac chopper from Nome. Our days are about the same as Nome for long and short. There are about 133 people--we come and go some. We are Ingalikmiut Eskimos.

After Bettles Field, that is were we are, was establish, there was no use for the barges to come up the river. So Old Bettles was abandoned.

Some of the common animals that are here are moose, caribou, wolf, and many other small animals.

Food costs more up here because there is no grocery store. The closest grocery store is in Fairbanks. There is not only the cost of the item, but also the cost of shipping. The cost of gas per gallon is \$2.65. I don't know what the average snowfall per winter is. This year, we have gotten around 3-4 feet of snow. Although this has been a very wet year. Our village has about 40 people in it. Our school has 13 students in it. There are 2 students in my grade.

In Fall time the men go out in the ice and catch a seal and bring it back to the town and give it to the ladys and the sew the skin togaher and the men put the skin on the boat and the men gat ready for boating. It is fun. We get to see a whale in real life. The men go out and go hunting for the whale. There are between 3 and 8 men in each skin boat. The skin is bleached seal skin. The elderly women (akaa)bleach the skins and the men and boys build the boats. One man in the back steers the boat. One man harpoons the whale while the others paddle. They use a bomb on the harpoon. When a whale is caught they use a block and tackle system to pull the whale up on the ice. The whole village pulls.

The initial "welcome" message from Caryn Camp to the participating teachers:

Welcome teachers!

This discussion will only be viewable by the teachers (not the students) participating in this online conference.

The purpose of this discussion is to introduce ourselves, talk about our goals/concerns/questions/ideas for this online conference, and get used to the process ourselves.

About myself, this is my first year in Alaska. I have spent almost all of my 34 years in New England - from Connecticut to New Hampshire to Maine, though was at Georgetown U for a year in Washington D.C. many years ago, and have spent the last 2 in upstate New York with my parents. I am changing my career from that of a laboratory biochemist, and had a tough decision between the Master's program at Syracuse University vs. here at the University of Alaska Southeast. I chose the latter because of its emphasis on technology, and for the adventure. Though Syracuse U has the Leu and Leu expertise on their staff (two of the masters in educational technology), they are on sabbatical this year. I fell in love with Alaska last summer, as I experienced the glaciers calving in the Tracy Arm Fjord, the bears at Pack Creek on Admiralty Island, and my first time kayaking! I would consider staying, and even working in the bush, if I had any family here at all. But it is just me, and my family is important to me, and VERY FAR AWAY! So I am looking forward to returning to Vestal, New York where I hope to teach 5th or 6th grade. I have to fly back for the New York State Certification Exam on April 21st, so I will interview there at that time. And that's about me! I am very much looking forward to this project, both for the students and for me. It is fun to communicate with each of you.

Please send me a list of any students who will be participating in this conference. I will register them as users next week, and they will have "moderated" status. That means that anything they write and submit will have to be previewed by me, the host, before it is posted to the conference. That is just a precaution against any inappropriate language being posted.

You, as teachers, do not have "moderated" status - that means anything you write now will be posted immediately.

If an adult acts as a scribe or typer (who edits) for the student, I think I would like in parentheses at the end of the entry something like (scribed) or (edited)...just for my own information.

The students will be registered as their first name plus the name of their town. For example, Peter in Juneau. Although I have registered the teachers as their first and last name for this teachers' conference, I will also register you as (for example) "Ms. Logsdon in Wasilla." and "Miss Camp in Juneau." I think it would be helpful for us to use those names if and when we post an entry in the conference, because it would let the reader know that 1) we are a teacher, and 2) where we are from.

A couple things to think about...

For those of us who have many students, we may want to keep watch for any students who ask questions and don't get a response, and read out-loud that entry to our own students, and ask for volunteers to respond.

To lessen the amount of computer time needed, you may consider printing out the posted comments (daily or weekly) and putting them up in the classroom for your students to read.

When planning this online conference, I tentatively mapped out the topics of discussion for the first 5 weeks, based on looking at the past, present, and future of Alaska, and an opportunity for students to connect with each other. Here is what I envision:

For the first week, I'm thinking of giving the kids an opportunity just to introduce themselves and say where they are from, and mention what they like best about where they live, and what they like least. Perhaps they might describe the geography and culture of where they live a little bit. On the second week, I would like kids to write about a typical "day in the life" of a winter day and a summer day where they live.

On the third week, I would like kids to discuss what their town/village was like when their grandfather was a kid.

On the fourth week, I would like kids to discuss what they think Alaska (or their village) will be like in 20 years, and what they wish it would be like.

On the fifth week, I would like kids to think about how they can make a difference (now or as an adult) in their town or in Alaska.

The questions move from being pretty concrete in the beginning, to more reflective and opinion-type topics. We can continue the conference as long as we feel it is manageable and beneficial. Please feel free to offer suggestions for topics of discussion. A recipe exchange may be fun as well.

The kids in Sue's and my classroom are broken into 5 groups, and each group is focusing on one of those 5 topics I mentioned. Of course, we have 27 students - and I know many of you have only a few students. Let me know what would be helpful for you. I think we'll learn as we go, so we'll just have to dive in and give it a whirl...and adjust as necessary.

I look forward to our sharing of ideas this week. I know some of you have a lot more experience with this than I, so feel free to offer suggestions, comments, ideas...! Post any of your questions here as well!
